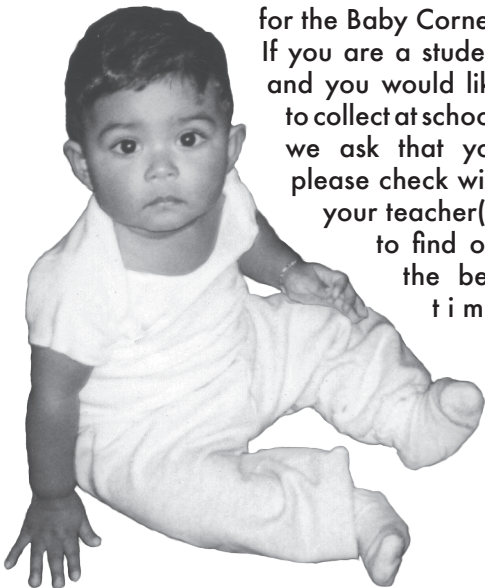
## Volunteer Opportunities

**W**here do families living in poverty turn when there is no money for diapers, a car seat, or a place for a newborn to sleep?

The Baby Corner often receives calls in crisis situations, or when there is no place else to turn. We provide families with car seats, portacribs, diapers, clothing, and other essential items. Through the generosity of our donors, the Baby Corner has even bought headstones and provided for the burial of infants whose families were unable to do so.

Why are we needed? Founded in 1988, St. Joseph's Baby Corner helps "plug the gap" left by public assistance programs. Such programs provide subsidies for food but not for diapers, bottles, detergent, and other critical items. The Baby Corner works with service providers—nurses and social workers—to distribute more than \$500,000 worth of goods every year.

### Needed Items

- Diapers (disposable or cloth), all sizes
- Diaper rash ointment and wipes
- Vinyl pants and diaper covers
- Infant formula (with iron), especially Similac and Enfamil
- Baby wash
- Baby clothes, especially sleepers, blanket sleepers, T-shirts
- Board books
- Laundry soap (Dreft) and detergent
- Blankets (crib or receiving), quilts
- Toys (newborn through preschool): developmental toys such as nesting cups and stacking rings, push/pull toys, Duplos, toy telephones, musical toys for babies, coloring books with crayons and markers
- Teething rings and rattles
- Personal hygiene items for new moms: maxi sanitary pads, hand soap (bar or liquid)

### Do You Knit, Crochet, or Quilt?

We are grateful for handmade afghans, blankets, and clothing for babies. Fleece blankets are great, too, and make a good service project for younger volunteers!

Guidelines for knitted/crocheted items:

- Only acrylic yarns, no wool
- No textured, bouclé-type yarns
- Minimum size: 36" x 36"
- Machine-washable materials only

Even if you don't sew, crochet, or knit anymore, we'd love to have your leftover fabric and yarns!

### Be a Santa's Helper!
